



The **Clinical Trials Network (CTN)** was created as part of our ongoing efforts to speed up autism research. The CTN is a network of research centers collaborating on clinical trials, which enables researchers to enroll children around the country. Such collaboration makes it possible to reach recruitment goals in a much shorter amount of time than any single site could on its own. This means that clinical trials will be completed much more quickly and will lead to faster results for the autism community.
